2009's winner was Louise Trim who received the WDP Silver Sickle Perpetual trophy and a cheque for £200 from Greenslade Taylor Hunt at the Royal Bath & West Show. Louise is Dorset YFC chairman and stepped into the breach when the county federation abruptly lost it's full-time organiser. Since then she has been travelling from her home in Henstridge, near Yeovil, to the county office in Dorchester to deal with administration and membership issues, as well as charring meetings in the evenings.

Sam Braddick, secretary of Gillingham and Shaftesbury Show, said Louise had been "keeping the Dorset federation together". "This is quite a daunting job in itself but when she has a full-time job as a farm administrator at one of the largest and most successful farming and cheesemaking concerns in the area (Clothier Family's Wyke Farms enterprise), Louise really has had a challenging time." The competition, now in it's third year, is open to Young Farmers in Somerset, Dorset, Devon, Gloucestershire, Wiltshire, Herefordshire and Monmouthshire. All entries will be judged on the basis of the contribution any member has made to their local communities, or to good causes, over the last 12 months and for the work they have done to raise the profile of the movement in general.

A similar award for club's is sponsored by J24 Ltd, in the amount of £400, which was won this year by Wells and Glastonbury. The 71 year old club has already been named fundraiser of the year within the Somerset YFC federation and from March to August 2008 raised £7,000 for Cancer Research, through a series of events ranging from a promise auction to completing the fivepeaks challenge.

'Sakara Holsteins to 2300 gns in May Collective Sale'

Greenslade Taylor Hunt's farm sales team were back in Sedgemoor Auction Centre for the Annual May Collective Sale on Tuesday 26th May in front of a ringside full of potential buyers from Staffordshire to Cornwall and Wales. Freshly calved cows and heifers from South West breeders started the day with Les and Karen Bennett's calved heifer 'Lilylane Wildman Roma 43rd' topping this section at 2,200gns. She was from three generations of VG and by the Ladys-Manor Wildman PI ET. The 10 heifers from the Lilylane herd had the day's highest collective average of £1997.10. Close behind with 5 heifers averaging £1978.20 were Roland and Simon Bugler's 'Bettiscombe' heifers which sold to 2,100gns for 'Bettiscombe RSVP Suzette 53rd' by Kamps-Hollow Convcd RSVP she was giving 32 kgs daily.

The fresh milk was followed by the 'Sakara' herd sale for DR Glanfield of Grove Farm, Wellington. An exceptionally dairy type of cow that had classified well generated a tremendous amount of interest with 9 of the 36 lots forward selling for over 2000gns. The herd contained some Red and Whites which were much sought after and it was the Red and White March calved heifer 'Sakara Checkers Red' (GP81) that achieved the day's top price at 2,300gns, she was by Lotto Red, as was 'Sakara Lucky red' (GP81) out of a (VG86) Dam she was giving 32.2 kgs. and sold for 2,100gns. The heifer calves that followed their dams were in strong demand selling to 700gns for the March born 'Sakara Vonny 3rd' by 'Sterndale Roseman Red' and out of the (Ex90) Yvonne cow in her 6th lactation that realised 2,000gns.

The dispersal was followed by some Jersey yearlings from the 'Jayherd' which averaged £435.75.

Several consignments of incalf heifers were sold to conclude the sale. New Zealand bred heifers due July onwards from JC & DC Board sold to 1680gns twice and pedigree incalf heifers from SE Voysey & Son sold to 1610gns for 'Inspiration Jannex Amber' due in August to the Hereford. The only heifer calf in the collective section was from the 'Inspiration' herd and sold for 530gns for a March born 'Pen-Col Allocate' daughter. Autumn calving heifers like the cows attracted premium prices - a sign of the times.

Livestock Pennage Security Policy

To prevent the escape of livestock from the pennage area, please ensure:-

Outer loading bay gates are securely chained to vehicle tail board gates when unloading or loading stock. **It will be deemed negligence if this is not done.**

Second set of loading bay gates to be secured with chain (cattle) and sliding fastener (sheep) after unloading.

Gates are always to be left in closed position when vacating loading bays.

In the event of an escape raise alarm and ensure entrance and exit gates are closed. Once entrance and exit gates are closed, then proceed to recapture stock.

Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.

All cattle born after 15th April 1998 require two tags

Somerset Trading Standards require any such cattle presented at market with less than two tags to be returned home under licence. Please ensure all cattle have a tag in each ear before leaving home. If a tag is lost in transit, please present tag to STS Animal Health representative for onward licence and sale.

If asked to remove your vehicle by a member of staff or fellow market user, please do so. Abusive behaviour will not be tolerated. Any complaints with respect to the use of the loading bays are to be reported to the section Auctioneer.
